# Child care center, restaurants reopen

### After Public Health reinstates sanitary permits

#### **Pacific Daily News**

A child care center and restaurants have reopened after passing follow-up sanitation inspections and having their sanitary permits reinstated, according to the Department of Public Health and Social Services' Division of Environmental Health.

Precious One's Childcare and Learning Center in Sinajana had its sanitary permit reinstated on April 22 after a DEH follow-up inspection.

DEH suspended the center's permit on March 21 after a cockroach infestation and other violations were found.

#### LA Tofu & Galbi

LA Tofu & Galbi in Tamuning has also reopened.

DEH ordered the restaurant's temporary closure on April 11 for health and sanitation rule viola-

It was assessed on April 24, but pest activity was still observed at the time so their sanitary permit remained suspended.

However, on May 1, a follow-up inspection found no violations so the restaurant's sanitary permit was reinstated, Public Health said.

#### RIHGA catering

The same day, RIHGA Royal Laguna Guam Resort catering in Tamuning also underwent a follow-up inspection with no violations observed. DEH reinstated their sanitary permit.

Before that, Public Health had

visited the Tamuning hotel on April 26, but inspectors observed pest activity so their sanitary permit remained suspended.

The catering permit was suspended on March 29 after an inspection found 64 demerits, resulting in a "D" grade.

The presence of insects, rodents and/or animals were observed during the March 29 inspection, Public Health said.

#### Demerits for other restaurants

Other restaurants that Public Health inspected between April 21 and May 11 included Panda Express in Hagatña, Taco Bell in Hågat, Fin Japanese Restaurant in Dededo, Jack in the Box in Tamuning, Wendy's in Tamuning and KFC in Mangilao.

Most of the inspections were in

response to complaints, except for Taco Bell and Fin Japanese Restau-

Panda Express had seven demerits and got an "A" grade after an inspection on April 25.

Taco Bell in Hågat got 11 demerits and a "B" grade after an inspection the same day.

Fin Japanese Restaurant was inspected on May 3 and got 18 demerits and a "B" grade.

Jack in the Box in Tamuning was inspected on May 7 and got 10 demerits and an "A" grade.

Wendy's in Tamuning was inspected on May 8 and got 22 demerits and a "C" grade.

KFC in Mangilao got three demerits and an "A" grade after a May 11 inspection.

Oceanview Middle passed its inspection on May 9 with 36 demerits and a "C" grade.

# Volunteers needed to install 3,050 flags on Memorial Day

A total of 3,050 flags will adorn the historic World War II invasion beach in Asan to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Guam in alignment with Memorial Day observances across national parks.

The War in the Pacific National Historical Park in Asan is set to host this poignant tribute this Memorial Day.

From Saturday, May 25, to Tuesday, May 28, the park will display a commemorative flag exhibit at Asan Beach, honoring the memory of those who served and sacrificed during World War II.

Each of the 3,050 flags holds significance, representing either one of the 1,880 U.S. service members who lost their lives during the 1941 Japanese attack and the 1944 liberation battle for Guam or one of the 1,170 CHamoru people who perished during the war years on Guam,



according to a press release from the National Park Service.

"This year's event helps to mark an important point in the history of Guam, the Marianas, and the nation as 2024 is the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Guam from the Japanese," NPS said.

#### How you can help

Each evening of Memorial Day weekend, on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, visitors can experience a stirring scene as 3,050 flags illuminate individually across Asan Beach after sunset.

Volunteers are sought to install flags beginning at 7 a.m. on Saturday, May 25, and work for three to four
